Notes On Initial and Continuing Claims: Regions Footprint

Initial Claims

During the week ending April 3, a total of 243,716 people within the Regions footprint applied for Unemployment Insurance benefits, down from 260,983 people in the week ending March 27;

Iowa, Illinois, Missouri, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, and Tennessee saw increases in initial claims in the week ending April 3;

Nationally, 612,919 people filed claims during the week ending April 10, down from 766,751 in the week ending April 3.

Continuing Claims:

As of the week ending March 27, a total of 1,239,815 people within the Regions footprint were receiving regular Unemployment Insurance benefits, up from 1,202,419 in the week ending March 20;

With the exceptions of Iowa, Indiana, Kentucky, North Carolina, and Texas, each infootprint state saw an increase in continuing claims in the week ending March 27;

It should be noted that declines in continuing claims can reflect either people having exhausted their regular state-level benefits or having returned to work;

More than 2.694 million people across the Regions footprint are drawing Unemployment Insurance benefits through the various pandemic relief programs; these numbers are not included in the regular claims data cited above.
